Why Learn French?



Preparation for School

Most schools offer French as a second language at a young age. Adequately prepare your child for their French program at school or enrich their French immersion experience.

Bilingualism & Opportunities

The official languages of Canada are English and French. Knowing French provides a huge advantage for future opportunities and opens more doors socially and professionally.

International Language & Travel

French is the only language other than English to be spoken on all five continents. Due to the rise of French in Africa, French is one of the fastest growing languages in the world.

Complementary Learning

Learning French aids the learning of other languages such as Spanish and Italian. Young learners will discover French and English complement each other. Learning French will further your understanding of English! A significant percentage of English vocabulary is derived from French.

Class Levels



Beginner - JK-SK

Learn the French alphabet, greetings, and how to introduce yourself. Each class includes simple cue cards, memorable French music, short French stories to build understanding, and arts & craft projects to enhance retention.




Intermediate - Grades 1-2

Learn French phonics to confidently read entertaining French stories. Each class includes eight French cue cards with practical sentences and French music to aid memorization. Students complete hands-on projects to further develop their French learning.

Advanced - Gr 3-7

Dig deeper into French grammar, verb conjugation and sentence structure. Read more complex and memorable French stories to aid learning. In group projects, students utilize their French language skills which they've been working so hard to build!

2021 Fall Semester Dates & Learning Themes

Theme-Based Learning

Our cue cards, music, books, and in-class projects all work together to complement each other. Students get the necessary repetition to retain their new language. We stay on each theme for four weeks to allow for deeper learning on a certain topic.

There are two themes running every week. The first theme runs every Monday, Tuesday, Friday, and Saturday. The second theme runs every Wednesday, Thursday, and Sunday.

Students can attend class 1x a week to experience one theme or 2x a week to experience both themes.

Homework Review

We listened to parents' concerns about not being able to assist their child's French learning and we understand it can be hard to review new French vocabulary and phrases at home. After listening to this feedback, we created something unique and valuable to our French program. After each beginner and intermediate class, students receive videos reviewing their stories, cue cards, and sentences. These can be used multiple times for extra practice!

Unit Reviews

At the end of each 4 week unit, we conduct a unit review to assess your child's performance. This allows students to demonstrate what they learned and what they remember. Teachers connect the previous lessons and summarize the unit.
